














Message from the President

During the pandemic, we've been reminded how difficult a job it is to prepare our food. Restaurants were among the most impacted. They faced higher food costs, higher wages, and a shortage of workers as their employees sought jobs elsewhere during periods when restaurants were shuttered. I've often been reminded during the last two years of Breadcoin's first value: We laud those who grow and prepare our food for their role in sustaining human life.

I want to express my gratitude to our farmers, our truck drivers, our warehouse and grocery store workers, and especially our local restaurants that feed us. These restaurants provide more than food; they are a point of connection in our community. Isn't everyone excited when a new restaurant opens in our neighborhood? I'm thankful that Breadcoin partners with great local restaurants to feed the community.

Breadcoin had a record-breaking year in 2021 with 35,407 Breadcoins redeemed by our participating vendors. Each redeemed Breadcoin comes with a story, a connection, and a dignified meal. Tens of thousands of these connections were made last year. We expect that to double in 2022. Thank you to those who donated money each month to put Breadcoins into the community.

Breadcoins were used more frequently in schools in 2021 to create mobile food events and provide meals for students during school breaks. Center City Public Charter Schools exemplified this with the purchase of Breadcoins to ensure the students and their families could purchase a substantial meal during the holiday break when schools weren't open. Last year, students and their families ate at local restaurants, and the meals supported food businesses in underserved communities.

In addition to the more than 10,000 meals provided, the community used Breadcoin at 17 pop-up meals and mobile food events in 2021. These events extend kindness to our neighbors. I want to thank all those in the Breadcoin network that were part of the community response to hunger.

- 5. Own the assets used to grow, process, and prepare food



Breadcoins Redeemed 2021









Breadcoins Redeemed 2018-2021

Daily Bread

Anybody can use Breadcoins to get a meal of their choice, with dignity, while participating in a community-wide effort to include everyone. Those who can afford to help others supply the coins so all can receive and eat.

Purchases



Schools, agencies, and other entities purchase Breadcoins in large or small quantities. They use them in myriad ways – perhaps as incentives, for families in need, or to create a student-lunch program.

Mobile Events

When a community gathers, food makes it special. When everybody can participate, it's a true celebration of each person who contributes to the richness of the neighborhood, with none left out.

Flash Tables



Imagine coming upon a beautifully set table and realizing that there's a seat at the table for you. Breadcoin not only works metaphorically to include all; we also set those inclusive tables week to week.

A Hospital "Ecosystem"

Children's National Hospital is worldrenowned. They are also innovating in using Breadcoins internally to reduce burdens on already-stressed parents trying to feed their family while confined in the hospital.

The hospital social workers have discretion to give coins out to families who need them during their stay.

The hospital cafeteria accepts
Breadcoin as a form of payment.
Families can also use the coins, once they are discharged, at restaurants in their own neighborhoods.

We cash out monthly with Morrison Healthcare, the food service behind the cafeteria, as we do with all of our vendors. And, the coins go back into circulation at Children's.








Food Festivals

Imagine an event that includes the whole community and celebrates the richness and creativity of DC's community east of the river. The Poet Life Festival was an extravaganza of poetry, movement, dance, games, community and – of course – food.

Most food trucks that were participating in the event signed up to become Breadcoin vendors, and we were on site to offer Breadcoins to those who needed them so they could participate fully in this community gathering.

Seeing how effective this model was at integrating our food vendors and method of payment into an already-planned event helped us realize that Breadcoins can be a critical tool at mobile events and community gatherings.

We love the idea that anyone who formerly would have stayed away from an event out of shame for not being able to let their children get something to eat would now participate without stigma. We predict that Breadcoin usage at such events will skyrocket.





Farmers & Distillers Accepts Breadcoin

The Farmers Restaurant Group is beloved in DC with multiple restaurants to choose from. Farmers & Distillers, in the Chinatown area of DC, is the first to accept Breadcoins and is as suitable for a date night or special occasion as it is for a quick coffee at their breakfast bar.

With the inclusion of Farmers & Distillers in our vendor portfolio, we began seeing the benefit of encouraging everyone in the community to use Breadcoins to pay for their meals. This will further destigmatize the use of the coins and support the network.

This particular restaurant group does much good in the city and is, incidentally, farmer-owned, making Farmers & Distillers an ideal vendor for Breadcoin.
