
# **Breadcoin Foundation** Annual Report 2022













#### Message from the President, Scott Borger

As I look back on 2022, I'm incredible grateful for the thousands of people who participated in the Breadcoin economy. You are a generous network of people caring for each other using the community food token. In February 2022, when Russia invaded Ukraine, we were reminded about the vulnerability of our global food supply chain and how susceptible low-income communities around the world are to food inflation. We must build resiliency into our global food supply chain, and that is what we are doing through this network of generous people.

Last year, Breadcoin was able to expand to a new region — the Pennsylvania Capital region, originate new microloans for the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, participate in dozens of mobile community events and popup table meals, and build the capacity of the organization to expand deeper into our current areas and into new communities across the country and around the world in the coming years.

Breadcoin's community-based payment system continues to create a multiplier effect with dozens of nonprofits receiving a food budget, tens of thousands of people receiving a meal with the dignity of choice, and 68,232 Breadcoins redeemed in 2022 by way of 55 different restaurants, food trucks, and caterers in three different states.

I look forward to what is in store for Breadcoin in 2023!

I'm excited to see what's next with Breadcoin as we continue growing in DC, Baltimore, and Harrisburg and as we prepare to move into Tampa early next year.

#### Vision

A network of people meeting each other's needs through the use of a community food token.

#### **Values**

- 1. We laud those who grow and prepare our food for their role in sustaining human life.
- 2. We desire that all are fed and provided with the dignity of choice.
- 3. We often fail to recognize those most in need in our community, and an act of giving can begin to restore our hardened hearts.
- 4. We believe a common table, inclusive of the poor and marginalized, strengthens the fabric of our community.
- 5. We recognize the poor and those experiencing homelessness provide a valuable contribution to the network.

#### **Purpose**

To provide the community with a new way to:

- 1. Give to those in need
- 2. Improve access to locally prepared food
- 3. Invest in food businesses serving low-income communities
- 4. Resource local nonprofits and congregations to ensure that all are fed
- 5. Own the assets used to grow, process, and prepare food

#### **Breadcoin Redemptions 2019-2022**





#### **Flash Tables**



Imagine coming upon a beautifully set table and realizing that there's a seat at the table for you. Breadcoin not only works metaphorically to include all; we also set those inclusive tables week to week.

#### Homecoming

Breadcoin is a network of people working together to meet needs of hunger, food insecurity, isolation and loneliness. We truly believe that connecting people is almost as important as feeding them, and statistics bear out the high cost of disconnection and isolation.

Our (first annual) Homecoming was held on a beautiful November day at Nativity Catholic Church in Brightwood (Ward 4) in DC.

All guests were treated to eight Breadcoins to spend at their choice of six vendors on site – Coleman's Kitchen, Royal Rooster, J&J Mex Taqueria, Donna Faye's Bakery, D.E.M. Pies and Blossom Bakery.


Those who wanted to could donate to help offset costs of the day, but it was truly a "come one-come all" gathering at which all were included at the common table we so value.

We had musicians on site as well as a live painter, Destine Clair, who captured the feeling of the day in a vibrant painting we will hang on our office wall.

This event, bringing together folks from all parts of Breadcoin and the city (and beyond), will be an annual event.







#### **Development Efforts**

This year we began seeking new and increased funding in a variety of ways. Up to this point, we had mostly sought memberships and donations from family and friends, individuals and by word of mouth.

2022 saw new funding come from several family foundations, some repeat gifts and some brand new. Those gifts ranged from \$3000 to a \$50,000 matching gift, which spurred on our team to raise more than \$50,000 in the fall.

We began a series of Breadcoin 101 events this year, gathering in a home each month. Individuals who have been enthusiastic about Breadcoin were approached and asked if they would host their own friends to learn about Breadcoin from our team, see our two-minute video, and be invited to join our work, whether financially or in some other way.

This model of cultivation of relationships for the long-term is in keeping with the relational nature of Breadcoin which is an ever-growing network of connections, spanning out from a hyperlocal neighborhood to a city, a region, a state and beyond.

#### **Our First Executive Director**

Since our inception in 2016, Breadcoin has been led by a dedicated crew of volunteers who have worked tirelessly on top of other jobs to lead our growing nonprofit.

Founder Scott Borger and Co-Founder Cary Umhau have led that work with several contractors, including our DC Leader William Spence (a key team member from way back) joining in to handle community engagement and day to day distribution and pick-up of coins.

The Board determined that we were at the point of our organization's growth and maturity that it was time to hire our first employee, an Executive Director, and after prayer and consideration, that role was offered to Cary Umhau.

Cary pivoted to this new role within Breadcoin and began on October 1, 2022, helping us move into the next phase of growth and maturity.

#### Harrisburg, PA

Through relationships with Aligned Works, a talent investment organization, Breadcoin became acquainted with David Vader, professor at Messiah University. David and Scott Borger began exploring what it would look like for Breadcoin to move into Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Besides being the state capital, Harrisburg has the benefit of being both urban and – quite nearby – rural, creating an ideal laboratory in which we could explore the intersection of those two milieus within proximity to each other in a region that felt ripe for Breadcoin's model.

We began recruiting vendors in Harrisburg, at the Broad Street Market and beyond, and soon Aisha Mobley was hired to become the Community Engagement Leader in Harrisburg. A dynamo of community engagement and organizing, Aisha has a huge heart and is connected to so many folks in need, nonprofits doing good work and – now – food businesses that want to serve the community.

Aisha and David, working together, increased the number of vendors in Harrisburg to 10 by year's end and began soliciting many organizations to purchase and use Breadcoins.

We are excited about Harrisburg's potential.

#### **Cornerstone Schools**

Breadcoin entered into a fruitful partnership with a private, Christian school in southeast DC (Ward 7), Cornerstone Schools.

Cornerstone had not been eligible for the federal lunch program because the school did not have a properly fitted kitchen. Many families wanted to have a hot-lunch program for their students and, thus, of course the school lost some families that wanted to attend.

Through innovations between Cornerstone and Breadcoin, we engaged Breadcoin vendors, Open Crumb and Mama's Pizza Kitchen, to provide hot school lunches two times a week. These meals are delivered or picked up, and the students benefit from locally prepared food, made with love, as they get a hot meal.

Breadcoin has been able to seek some additional funding from our donors to augment what families and the school are doing.

We've loved seeing this innovative use of our food token to feed children.
